

Sort your waste correctly!



Combustible waste (Poltettava jäte)

- board- and cardboard packages, wrappings, boxes, disposable plastic plates and cups
- damp and dirty paper and paper bags
- plastic: plastic bags, wrappings, packages, plastic bottles, lids, toys, pencils, polystyrene (styrox)
- babies nappies, sanitary towels
- textiles, shoes, handbags, brushes, make-up, rubber, leather, disposable shavers, folders
- ash and cigarette ends



Biowaste (Biojäte)

food leftovers, fruit and vegetable peels, coffee filters and teabags, kitchen papers, napkins, bones, eggshells, cut-flowers etc.

Please pack biowaste in a newspaper or paper bag!

Paper (Paperi)

clean and dry paper, newspapers, magazines, leaflets, catalogues, envelopes, printing papers, pocket books



Glass (Lasi)

clear and coloured bottles and jars (remove lids and caps, rinse, labels and collars need not to be removed)

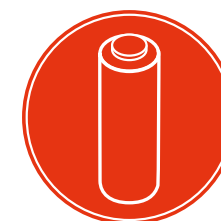


We reuse or recycle 96 % of all the waste.



Batteries (Paristot)

batteries, small accumulators



Metall (Metalli)

all metal tins and soft drink cans, caps and lids, tubes, foil, metal forms, kettles, pans, tools, nails, hinges, spray bottles, aluminum yoghurt lids, etc.



At the Waste Recycling Centre

Stormossen has 13 waste recycling centres where private households can bring hazardous, recyclable and reusable waste. Each centre has containers for the types of waste mentioned in this brochure. On this page you can read how to sort your waste correctly. The recycling centre staff is also happy to help and answer any waste-related questions.

Every household is given a loyalty card. Read more in the green box.

Bring your loyalty card.

Six free visits annually!

Waste that is charged on the card (6 free visits/household/year):



- Sofas, textiles, leather, mattresses



- Plastic (not PVC), polystyrene (styrox), damp and dirty paper and cardboard



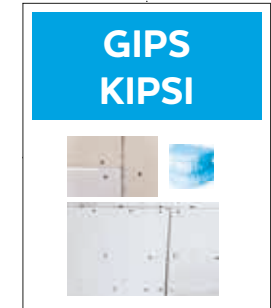
- Painted and unpainted wooden structures, hardboard, plywood, pallets



- Concrete, bricks, sinks, toilet bowls, clinkers, tiles



- Window panes, glass wool, PVC-plastic, fiberglass, skis



- Gypsum board (without plastic and vinyl wallpaper)

• Asbestos (maximum 50 litres)

Asbestos should be transported in packages and marked. Asbestos can be found, for example, in the insulation of old heating pipes and air shafts, fire protection, moisture and noise insulations, floor and ceiling sheets (such as Vartti roofing), building facade coatings (such as minerit boards), and roofing felt of old houses (mostly roofing felt used before 1980).

• Paper documents for shredding

When the free visits have been used you will be charged 15 €/visit when you come with waste that is chargeable.

Loyalty card

Bring your loyalty card each time you visit the recycling centre. If you do not already have a loyalty card, you will be given one on your first visit. The loyalty card allows each household six free visits to the recycling centre annually, plus an extra two free visits for a summer cottage.



Waste that is not charged (bring your card, every visit is registered):



Electrical and electronic equipment

- E.g. household appliances, power tools, entertainment electronics.



Branches and garden waste

- Compost garden waste, like leaves, grass cuttings and weeds. Branches and twigs should be delivered separately from other garden waste.



Hazardous waste

- Dry-cell and wet-cell batteries, fluorescent light tubes, energy-saving lamps, waste oil, paints, glues, varnishes, pesticides, solvents, impregnated timber.



Clothes for a collection box

- Usable and clean clothes, shoes, domestic textiles. Pack into plastic bags.



Metals

- All types of metal, e.g. metal tins, softdrink cans, roofing sheets, bicycle frames, oil tanks, draining boards, barrels, wood-burning sauna heaters.



Returnable glass

- Clear and coloured glass bottles and jars (rinse, labels and collars need not to be removed).



Recycled paper

- Newspapers, magazines, adverts, catalogues, paperback books, envelopes, printing paper.



Recycled cardboard

- Cardboard boxes, brown cardboard and kraft paper.
